

Neighborhood Partnership Program

The City of Oklahoma City's Neighborhood Partnership Program is a grant program that encourages low to moderate-income neighborhoods to plan and complete physical improvement or public safety enhancement projects in their areas. The city supplies a grant of up to \$10,000. The neighborhood provides volunteer labor, materials, professional services and cash as a matching contribution to their project.

Successful projects must result in a clear physical improvement or public safety enhancement that benefits a neighborhood and/or business area. Possible projects include:

- * Anti-graffiti efforts
- * Neighborhood identity signs
- * Community gardens
- * Park enhancements
- * Landscaping and trees
- * Playground improvements
- * Crime Watch

The Neighborhood Partnership Program is open to incorporated neighborhood-based groups in low-moderate income areas within the city limits of the City of Oklahoma City.

To Apply for a grant:

1. **This is REQUIRED.** Contact City of OKC staff at 297-2655 to determine neighborhood eligibility and discuss your potential project. If your area is eligible you will receive a confirmation letter from the city.
2. **Contact Neighborhood Alliance at 528-6322.** We can assist you with planning your project and putting your grant application together.
3. Meet with the appropriate city authorities to discuss your project and applicable permits.
4. Complete and submit your application.

Once the grant is submitted, it will be reviewed by the City of OKC's Neighborhood Services and Planning Departments to insure eligibility. Then a separate committee will review and rank proposals and forward their recommendations to the City Council Neighborhood Conservation Committee and the City Council for approval. Projects will be scored on their community benefits, participation, match & budget and maintenance.
